Dear Sir - In 1884 when I was in Bergen
I met your brother Mr. John Grieg
having an introduction to him from
Herr Didrik Grønold who stayed at the
same Hotel with my wife & myself on
the Lord's Day. I then wrote to you in reference
to the Birmingham Festival and the desire
I entertained that you should compose a
work for the celebrations in 1885. On my
return home however I found that the
arrangements were then too far advanced
to admit of this, but this year when I
was in Bergen I spoke about it again to
Mr. Grønold, and was pleased to hear
that you are in better health, so that I
hope you will be able to accept the
invitation of the Committee which I
forward in an official letter. If you
do so I trust you will stay at my house
whilst you are in England - Niels Gade
was with us on two occasions and I trust

we may be able to make you as
comfortable as he assured us he had
been. When with Mr Grievold in
last July we met you at the Railway
station near Bergen, but you were
talking to a friend, so that I denied
myself the pleasure of speaking to you
as I should have liked to have done.

Not being sure of your address
I will ask Mr Grievold to forward
this to you.

May I ask for a reply at your
early convenience.
