Dear Sir: I am writing in the name of the Committee or Managers of the Birmingham Musical Festival, to ask you to compose an Orchestral Work (probably a Sinfonietta) to be performed for the first time at their celebration at the end of August 1888, and to come over to conduct it yourself; this will enable you to see that everything is done to ensure a fine performance of your work. From the Programme of the Birmingham Festival which I sent you ^{in August 1884} in 1885 and my letters ~~at that time~~ you will have realized how celebrated a Festival that at Birmingham is; held once in three years and attended by about 12,000 people, many of them of the first musical talent in Great Britain, and this it is which has caused so many leading composers to desire to produce their works here; amongst them I may mention Mendelssohn, Ferdinand Hiller
