Dear Sir,

I received your letter from Leipzig dated 24 Nov and post card of the next day, but have been unable to reply earlier as I had to wait for a meeting of our Committee. The Birmingham Festival is looked upon as so important a musical event in England, that it is hoped you will be able to compose a Symphony specially for the one in August 1888 to be performed there for the first time, such a work would be a worthy introduction to an English audience; but if on consideration you feel you shall be unable to do this, our Committee will accept the two works you mention, namely, "An Orchestral Fantasy, Autumn Songs" occupying 15 minutes, and

Suite in old style for "Strong Orchestra"  
(by which I presume you mean, full  
Orchestra.)

Whether you produce the Symphony  
or the two pieces named, the Committee  
would consider your coming over  
to conduct as part of the arrangement,  
and although composers usually  
consider that the opportunity of a  
first performance at a Birmingham  
Festival is so advantageous, from  
the large audience & excellent  
performance, and adds so much  
to the value or sale of the work,  
that they are anxious for such  
~~opportunities~~ first performance  
without stipulating for any  
money payment, still I am  
authorized to say that if you

are present and conduct your  
works they will give you in  
addition to any reasonable  
cost you may incur in copying  
the Grand parts, Fifty guineas  
as an honorarium and in full  
for all your expenses.

May I ask you to inform me as  
as soon as convenient whether  
you assent to the suggestion of  
the Committee, and if so, whether  
you decide that you can or cannot  
compose a new Symphony, or  
prefer to give the two smaller works,  
also do you intend to score the  
First for orchestra (as I gather it  
is at present for two pianos) -  
also please say if either of the

works has been performed in  
public. as if they have not,  
then they must not be given  
before our Festival. would you reply  
to each of these questions. I hope  
our correspondence may lead  
to your giving a work at our  
Festival as so many other great  
composers have done
