My dear Mrs. Grieg:

Your and your
husband's very kind letters
were duly recd, & we were
very happy & delighted to hear
from you & to know you are
both well. Your English
was a great surprise to me,
so correctly expressed. I am
sure there will be no ob-
stacle in the way of our
correspondence on the ground
of language.

It was a great disappoint-
ment to us to learn that
you would not be able to
come here, but, now we
are encouraged to think
we may have the anticipated

pleasure of seeing you, as
"Tristan & Isolde" will be
given on the 14th & 18th of this
month. In a certainty.
Sunday morning we went
to Liszt's reception, & there
learned from the Grand Duke
himself, that he had just
telegraphed to the King of Bavaria
expressing the general desire
to hear the Opera on Monday
a despatch came saying
the Vogels would come.
Liszt played for Sunday
with Cello, a Sonate by
Saint-Saëns. also accom-
panied several Singers.
Two Piccolo (pupils) played
4 hd pieces. We go to him
three or four times a week.
The amability & patience
of that Great man is to

me astonishing, nearly every
day three or four go to him
to play & his interest seems
unabated, while I should
think it would be a per-
fect bore to him. Mr S
will soon play Mr Grieg's
Concerto to him. He speaks
very enthusiastically of
your husband & will be
very happy to have the
the Partitur of which Mr G
wrote to Mr S. He, Leijt
has called on us & we hope
to play on two Pianos
for him -

We are very contented
here & in very good health.

It is just the place for
me, & I hope to remain
till I return to America.

We shall send this to

Leipzig, & trust if you have
left, it will soon reach
you & also soon to hear
that you are coming.
