My dear Sir,

Mr Wolff has kindly handed  
me the letters you have sent him in  
answer to those he has been good  
enough to write you on my behalf  
in reference to your re-visiting  
England this season for a series  
of lectures and Recitals to be  
given <sup>under</sup> my auspices.

Before deciding anything definitely  
with you, I thought it desirable to  
communicate with the principal  
towns to ascertain if the time  
proposed for the tour would be  
a favourable one, and this must be  
my excuse for the delay in writing you.  
The answers I have so far received

no sort of all evening long, as they  
point out that the time proposed  
would be in Lent, which is always  
a bad one for concert giving, & then,  
again, the Crystal Palace, at which  
I proposed <sup>to give</sup> the Orchestra at Concert, & also  
Mr. Brown's bank are unable at  
present to settle anything. In the  
face therefore of these difficulties,  
I am writing to ask if you could  
defer your visit until October next  
year, when the prospects of success  
would be considerably more favorable.  
I should then be very pleased to close  
with you for 10 performances to be  
comprised within a period of 4 or 5  
weeks, beginning about the middle  
of October. The terms, ~~already~~ already mentioned  
to you by Mr. Wolff (£1000 for  
10 performances) I am willing to give  
you.
