Dear Sir,

I received yours of the 22nd ult, for which I thank you, and note that you agree to the Philharmonic Concert, which I have accepted for you on November 4th; should be one of the ten engagements I have arranged with you. I have told the Committee that you cannot conduct and play as well, they, therefore, wish you to appear as solo pianist only, and will be glad if you will kindly play your sonata in the first part of the programme, and two pieces (a + b) of your own composition in the second part. As they will be making up their programme shortly,

you select.

I shall now arrange for the other
nine concerts to follow the Philharmonic
date, and will let you know full
particulars as to the towns, etc, in
