Dear Madam

I have been away for a short holiday on the continent and only saw your letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> ult: on my return a few days ago.

At Madame Adora Henson, the lady I have engaged for the Dore, is a very excellent artist, a good musician and has sung at nearly all the best concerts in England and at many of our leading Festivals. I feel very confident you will be pleased with her, and that she will sing your compositions to your satisfaction in every way. She has sung for most of the prominent composers and conductors here

and to speak in the most favorable  
manner of her abilities. This encourages  
me to think you will find her a desirable  
artist in every way. She has a sweet  
and high soprano voice, and you will  
kindly let me know the titles of the songs  
you would like her to sing. I will get her  
to prepare and study them very carefully,  
at once, so that she may be ready to  
go through them with you on your  
visit at London.

I have seen Mr. Chappell and  
he says that your string quartet (Op. 27)  
was performed at one of his concerts  
last season, and if you particularly wish  
it he would prefer announcing it again,  
but would prefer your playing a Sonata  
at each of his two concerts and a short  
suite of solos to follow. Mr. Wolff will
